Gateshead District Station Manager Scott Wilson, of Tyne and Wear Fire and Rescue said: *“With the warm and dry weather we’ve been enjoying recently, our firefighters have been dealing with a number of fires across the wider Gateshead area.*

*“Setting fires might seem like harmless fun, but they can quickly get out of control. A small grass fire can spread rapidly, becoming much larger and more dangerous.*

*“If you set a fire, you are putting your own life and the lives of others - including our firefighters - at risk. Deliberate fires damage the environment and tie up emergency services who could be responding to real emergencies.*

*“We’re working closely with the Local Authority and Northumbria Police to reduce anti-social behaviour and deliberate fire setting in this area.*

**“We ask all parents to please speak to their children about the dangers of setting fires.**
